### **Wyre Piddle Parish Council News**

#### **Presentation on Pershore Infrastructure 28<sup>th</sup> November 2019 Village Hall.**

Mark Mills from Worcester County Council provided us with an update on current and planned works, affecting Pershore and surrounding areas which covered:

Pinvin junction changes, Northern bypass plans and planned footpath on Wyre Hill.

First of all, can I say a big thank you to all of you who attended this meeting – we had almost 40 villagers who came along to both familiarize themselves with what's happening and to take the opportunity to ask any questions.

**Pinvin Junction** – this work has already commenced and plans were available for viewing which showed what the changes are and what the junction will look like. Completion date is expected to be between June and August, but Mark did explain that this will need to tie in with work outstanding at the traffic lights on Station Road which is due to be completed by Persimmon Homes.

**Northern Bypass** – planning has been approved for this and we are awaiting a start date with an overall timescale of around 2 years looking likely. Again plans were available to view on the evening (showing new road over railway line) to demonstrate the impact of this new route and there was very positive feedback that this will be good for Wyre Piddle in terms of reducing the traffic, particularly lorries, at the edge of the village and improving safety for local vehicles entering and leaving the village.

**New footpath** – there weren't any start dates for this but it will dovetail into the development of the Northern bypass, thereby minimizing disruption. Although this won't stretch into the village, the feedback was still positive that it will provide some improved safety for walkers and cyclists. Any hedgerows that need to be removed to carry this out will be replaced.

The Parish Council will be in regular contact with Mark and will endeavor to provide further updates as plans develop. - Carole Townsend.

### **New town at Throckmorton!**

Thank you to those of you who sent in comments to Wychavon (& to Tony Peachey & Co) about the SWDP review. We think around 50 people from Wyre Piddle responded. Apparently 10,000 responses have been received overall so it will take them a while to collate views. The Parish Council will continue to find out how Wyre Piddle might be affected by the proposed changes in the future and will keep you posted of any new information that comes to light. The development at Throckmorton is of particular concern as there is likely to be a serious effect on traffic, pollution and a general strain on local infrastructure. There are also worrying implications that Wyre Piddle will be increasingly merged not only with development along the A44 corridor but also in the gaps between us and Pinvin and Pershore thereby losing our separate identity as a village. The threat of increased flooding must also be taken seriously as some of the proposed building is forecast for land currently on the Piddle Brook flood plain. In the meantime we are in touch with other local councils and asking our MPs to give a view of the way forward to ensure any future developments take into account the issues raised.
