Neighbourhood Watch

It has now been around 1 year since we set up the neighbourhood watch scheme in Wyre Piddle, and for some of you it may seem that apart from getting door stickers and street signs, not much has happened.

Well, I hope that some things have changed, like looking out for your neighbours, which many of us have been doing for years, and being more aware of scams and "suspicious" people in the village and letting people know about them. Do you know your immediate neighbours? If not, why not get to know them, let's be more neighbourly and get that community spirit going. It is looking out for each other that helps keep a community safe.

The neighbourhood watch website has some good information about keeping yourself and your property safe, but you need to be a member to access it. However, there is now an app designed by the Neighbourhood Watch which can be downloaded to your smart phones free of charge that sends you alerts and allows you to send alerts to people in Wyre Piddle and to other nearby groups if you see anything suspicious, and you don't have to be a member of the neighbourhood watch to use it. It allows us to let people know of suspicious activity in a fraction of the time that it would have taken by word of mouth. Our local police also use this app.

If you want to download the app, it can be found on sites such as Google Play Store. It is called WeAlert. Try it, and you will find out about the latest scams that are going around, and of burglaries in the area. Forewarned is forearmed.

Have you marked your goods with smart water yet? Have you got a smart water kit? If your goods are lost or stolen would you like the chance of getting them returned to you? If you mark your valuables with a registered smart water kit, if stolen and subsequently your goods are recovered by the police, then you can be reunited with them due to the unique marking of the smart water. The Parish Council bought a number of these kits to distribute free to villagers. We still have a several kits available should you wish to mark your property. Contact me if you have not been given a kit and I will arrange for you to get one.

There has (to the best of my knowledge) only been one burglary in the village over the last year, and a report of a suspicious van driving around filming houses. We are lucky to live in an area that is low in crime, but it must be devastating if you are the victim of said burglary. No-one wants to feel unsafe in their home, which is why we have neighbourhood watch. So, please do keep alert.
