

## Remembrance Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> November 2020



Unfortunately this year due to the current COVID-19 restrictions, we will not be able to hold the remembrance service at St. Anne's church or have the memorial service outside the village hall.

Instead there will be a service for the 5 parishes (Fladbury, Wyre Piddle, Lower Moor, Cropthorne and Charlton) held at The Church of St. John the Baptist at Fladbury. During the service the names from each parish memorial cross will be read out, the wreaths will be laid at the altar and there will be a two minute silence. After the service, the parish council chairperson will bring the wreath back to their village and lay it at the respective memorial.

Unfortunately, this service is restricted to 36 people. In attendance at the service will be –

A member of each parish church council
And 4 parishioners from each village

As there are only 4 parishioners per village permitted, a ballot will be held and 4 names will be randomly selected to be able to attend.
