New Bespoke Bus Service

We have a new bus service available to all villagers. It is called Worcestershire on Demand (WoD). The service has been set up by Worcestershire County Council and funded by the UK Government and previously rolled out to other parts of the County. WoD is a bespoke mini bus service which allows you to book a journey, choosing your starting point, destination and time.

You can book up to five days in advance and go to anywhere within the Wychavon zone, and to places of interest outside the zone, the maximum distance being 15km (9 miles) as the crow flies. The service operates Mon-Saturday 7am-7pm, costs £2.50 (less for additional passengers) and is FREE for CHILDREN UNDER 5 and PEOPLE WITH BUS PASSES. The service is not door-to-door, it uses pickup and drop-off points but these will vary depending on the route the bus takes.

You book your journey and receive updates about pickup time and place on an App, or by phone if you don't use Apps. All the information is here:

The Parish Council has been trying, unsuccessfully, to get improvements in the woeful bus service through the village, and think that this is an excellent alternative offering from WCC and encourage you to make use of it.


Since 1911, the Hall has been run by a Committee, although the current team doesn't go back quite that far! In fact the team now in place, dates back to 2010 when Stephen Malkinson took on the Chairmanship. That era ended at this year's AGM, when Stephen retired after 15 years.

Under Stephen's guidance, the Hall has been improved in many ways including the installation of central heating, full roof insulation, replacement of hard plastic chairs with soft padded stacking ones. The Hall has been redecorated inside and out and brickwork repointed to ensure good levels of maintenance and appearance.

The Hall is well used and hosts many Village events and activities from Table Tennis to Quizzes and Piddle Pics to our recent VE Day Celebrations.

Stephen has created and lead a great team over those 15 years and we thank him for his enthusiastic leadership and wish him a very happy retirement.

Fete Funds

The Fete seems a long time ago, but we have had several enquiries about what the funds raised at the fete are used for. The Fete has never been run in order to raise funds, but rather as a day of entertainment for the village, which is why no entrance fee is charged. Having said that, obviously you are generous with your spending and the proceeds do benefit many good causes. All of the profit from the stalls run by the WI (Teas, cakes and spin-a-cake) were donated to St Richard's Hospice – over £450. St Anne's Church ran the raffle and raised £760 which will be used for cutting the churchyard grass. The Scouts and the Table Tennis club were able to boost their funds, donations were made to Severn Area Rescue Association (SARA)

who demonstrated lifesaving using a throw line, and to the Avon Navigation Trust who provided a boat and volunteers to help with the ever popular boat trips. The balance of the profit (after vital expenses like toilet hire!) including some of the boat donations and profit from the games, bar and food, was about £860 and goes to the Wyre Piddle Community Events. This fund is available to anyone wanting to hold a community event or start a regular community activity, for example for seed funding or start-up village hall hire. Parish Council Update

We have several updates from the Parish Council:

Recruitment: Firstly, we are sad that Alistair Locke, our youngest Parish Councillor, has moved out of the village and therefore resigned from the Parish Council. We thank him for his work at the Parish Council and are now looking to co-opt someone else to join our team. Are you interested? It is rewarding to work towards improvements for our community, and we are a friendly team, so if you'd like further information please email Lisa Cope on clerk@wyrepiddlepc.org.uk or speak to one of the Parish Councillors — Harvey Laud, Yvette Butler, Penny Carr, Harry Parsons, Tony Loizou and Lisa Fullagar.

Planning: You have probably received a letter from RCA regeneration regarding Morro Partnerships Ltd's plans to build 42 affordable homes on Wyre Hill. The land is the triangle bounded by Wyre Hill, the railway and the Piddle Brook (on your right as you leave the village). If you scan the QR code you can see the proposed plans and comment on them. Any comments you make at this stage will be seen by the developer but NOT by the planning officers or the Parish Council. The developer is not asking whether you support the development or not, but allowing you to express your opinion about their preliminary plans. Whether you choose to engage with this pre-planning consultation or not please bear in mind that when they do apply for planning consent a formal planning consultation will take place and comments made now will not be carried forward. The Parish Council has not been involved in the development of this proposal. As soon as a formal planning application is made and the finalised plans are available we will hold a public meeting at the Village Hall to gauge the opinions of our parishioners and will make our formal response on your behalf following that meeting.

Resuscitation Training: We have organised a resuscitation training session (CPR and using a defibrillator) which will be provided by the Pershore First Responders. This is booked for Wednesday 15th October, 7pm at the Village Hall. Places are available to any parishioner - we still have some places available which are being allocated on a first come first served basis . If you'd like to come, please email pennycarr@wyrepiddlepc.org.uk.

Rescue Kit: A few years ago we installed a rescue pole and throw line at the bottom of Smith's Meadow. These are the state-of-the-art recommended equipment for rescuing someone in

trouble in the water. They are safely housed in locked cabinets with clear instructions on how to access them (call 999, ask for the fire service, tell them the location on the board, they will tell you the code). Because they are considered safer than the previous lifebuoy (which is not locked and is misused and vandalised every summer) we will be removing the lifebuoy in the near future.

Next Meeting: We have changed the day on which we have Parish Council Meetings. They are now on the last Wednesday of alternate months, so the next one is at the Village Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 24th September. Everyone is welcome.
